Founded in 1999, Nunavut is the newest territory and a place where tradition meets progress. This position offers an opportunity to take on responsibilities that are territorial in scope and will appeal to those who are eager to develop and lead during a time of exciting change, while enjoying Nunavut's parklands, winter landscapes, Inuit arts and culture.

Reporting to the Assistant Deputy Minister of Infrastructure, the Regional Director, Infrastructure will be responsible for providing strategic leadership and accountability for capital project delivery and asset management within the 12 regional communities. The Regional Director will oversee the planning, development and execution of the Department's project management and asset management procedures that support the effective and efficient delivery of programs and services at the regional level. The Regional Director will manage procurement strategies and oversee all capital projects delegated to the Department of Community & Government Services (CGS), having an annual value in the range of \$70-million in addition to the operations and management (O&M) budget of nearly \$23 million. The Director will also serve as an advisor to Regional Managers and other clients across the GN departments and communities by providing expertise in planning, design and delivery, and monitoring performance to ensure that client needs and program objectives are being met.

As Regional Director, Infrastructure, you should have strong knowledge of asset management and project management best practices and industry standards (PMBOK), best practices and related industry standards (PMI, IFMA, BOMA), with proven strengths managing multiple stakeholders and building consensus. The incumbent must be familiar with northern construction practices and political, social and cross-cultural practices. The ability to review technical information and proposals, analyze risk and make informed decisions is an essential skill for this position, as are financial, budgeting and analytical skills to evaluate program results against set schedules, budgets and quality objectives. The Regional Director must be adept at managing consultants and staff, and balancing competing priorities.

This position requires an experienced and skilled leader of people and projects, with at least eight (8) years of facility management, and/or project management and/or strategic management experience in either the public sector or the private sector. A recognized degree or diploma in Architecture/ Engineering or a similar related discipline is required. Designations such as a Professional Engineer, Architect, Project Management Professional (PMP) RPA/FMP, etc are all considered as assets. The ability to speak Inuktitut is an asset. Knowledge of Inuit language, communities, culture, land and Inuit Qaujimatugangit is an asset.

Equivalencies that consist of an acceptable combination of education, experience, knowledge, skills and abilities may be considered.
