If you have glass, we want to know, and invite you to contact Joel Berman Glass Studios to determine the suitability of your material for reprocessing. Here is how it works.

JBGS wants:

- Single glazed interior float glass
- Glass from interior doors
- Glass from interior side lights
- Glass from interior wall dividers
- Glass from interior conference rooms
- Width - variable
- Height - minimum 96" - 108" tall
- Tempered or not

JBGS does not want:

- Double glazed exterior windows
- Exterior coated curtainwall
- Coated glass
- Laminated glass
- Auto windshields
- Colored glass

Suitability As potential recycle projects are identified, JBGS staff will visit your location to:

- Acquire material samples for reprocess testing
- Determine the quantity of available glass
- Determine glass dimensions
- Devise a plan for transporting glass to JBGS factory

Harvesting If your glass is suitable for reprocessing, JBGS will coordinate with your demolition contractors for a date and time for the removal stacking, and transport of glass materials from your facility.

Documentation Upon removal of your glass material, JBGS will provide to you documentation on the quantity and weight of glass materials removed from your facility and entering our 100% post consumer recycled glass supply chain. The documentation received from JBGS may help your project to qualify for potential LEED points in your remodel plans.

Benefits What this means for you:

- Reduced disposal / landfill costs
- Possible LEED points assigned to your project
- Satisfaction in knowing that you actively participated in the positive redesign of industrial material flows. Each piece of glass material entering the JBGS recycled pilot program correspondingly eliminates the following processes associated with the production of new glass material
 - Mining of sand, limestone
 - Pollution from soda ash production
 - Energy used to produce new glass sheet at 1500°F
 - Fuels used to transport glass from supplier to JBGS
